Welcome and Acknowledgement of Country	<i>Welcome</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introductions and Acknowledgement of Country • Agenda Summary • Sparked Team Overview
Update on AU CDI R1 and AUeReqDI R1	<i>AU CDI R1 Update</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AU CDI R1 was published in June; additionally the backlog, de-identified feedback, and responses have since been published on the Sparked website • There were over 50 respondents and over 400 lines of feedback. Based on the feedback, 16 data items were added, two data items were removed, and 126 data items were placed in the backlog. <i>AUeReqDI R1 Update</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The draft for comment is now closed and we received 26 submissions with over 110 lines of feedback. AUeReqDI R1, along with the feedback and responses summary, are currently on track to be published in October 2024.
AU Core TDG Update	<i>AU Core TDG Update</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The three areas of focus for the AU Core include implementation guides, the piloting and testing of the standards and establishing reference capabilities and services

	<p>to enable people to ensure that their applications and products adhere to the standards</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are 505 participants in the AU Core TDG and an average of 65 attendees at each meeting • The AU Core Implementation Guide R1 ballot for comment was released earlier in the year and had 199 issues reported against the IG and out of those, 92 changes were made the AU Core standard • AU Core R1 testing occurred in June and August and saw 19 different systems participating in testing • Deployment of the AU Core Reference FHIR Server is in progress, Deployment of the reference Ontoserver is complete and Inferno, Smart App Launch and FHIR CLI validator test guides have been published <p><i>Current Activity</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AU core ballot process has commenced and a release for ballot will be through in the next month <p><i>Future Plans</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Currently in R1 ballot period, and this spans to the beginning of September. Ballot reconciliation will occur from September to October and publication will occur at the end of January 2025 • Scoping for R2 will commence at the beginning of December 2024
<p>May Face-to-Face Workshop and Sparked Rural and Remote Health Equity Round Table Recap</p>	<p><i>May F2F CDG Workshop</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The last in-person CDG workshop was a 1-day event held in Sydney with 90+ attendees • Results of the activities have been posted on the Sparked website. <p><i>Sparked Rural & Remote Health Equity Roundtable</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This workshop held in Darwin in July, aimed to understand what are the use cases that require a rural/remote context and for First Nation populations • There was similar discussion of chronic disease management and patient summary, however, greater discussion surrounding broader use cases between government agencies including correctional services, child health records, NDIS, Aged Care and the challenges accompanying system workarounds during periods of disconnect • Discussions and points were raised around culture and connectedness to culture, in addition to oral health and supporting alternative care such as bush medicine • Social Determinants of Health, Social and Emotional Wellbeing, Health Behaviours and Plan of Care were identified as high priority data elements

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The AUCDI backlog has been updated with new things raised by participants at both the CDG F2F in May and the Health Equity Roundtable in July
<p>AUCDI R2 Planning and Sept. Community Co-Design Workshop Prep</p>	<p><i>AUCDI R2</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • From the two workshops, the top 12 most highly prioritised use cases are forming the starting point for AUCDI R2 scope <p><i>Group Discussion</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AUCDI releases are running on a yearly cycle, with the goal of publishing a first draft of R2 in February and a final publish in June to then commence R3 • Adoption of standards being developed in AUCDI is occurring across systems, with both smaller and larger systems looking at how to adopt things from the Sparked program. The core foundation of the standard is still being developed to ensure that it supports all kinds of interactions. AU eRequesting processes, smart forms and FHIR questionnaires will likely be visible first within clinical practice • The international patient summary (IPS) was used as a guideline and starting point to help develop patient summary, however, there are still some elements to satisfy the IPS in the backlog • There has been commitment and confirmation from all states and territories that they are founding members and support the Sparked program and Sparked are trying to actively work with all industry who are being implemented across the state • As part of the clinical transformation occurring across the country, vendors and vendor partners can be asked about how they are adopting and implementing AUCDI and how it fits within their roadmap. This also helps to highlight the customer demand to assist prioritisation the product roadmap <p><i>Future Events</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are plans to have a similar workshop to the July Sparked Rural & Remote Health Equity Roundtable in WA in November this year • Sparked are planning to have the first in-person CDG meeting in February 2025 in Adelaide, SA <p><i>High-level concepts – Planned approach (see slide pack for more detail)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SEWB, SDOH, Health behaviours <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ For the items that can be structured - The proposed approach for R2 is to expand upon tobacco smoking to add additional elements and to add alcohol and substance use ○ For the other SDOH items in the backlog - There are two possible patterns included within the R2 social

	<p>and emotional well-being proposal – narrative only and narrative + status. The proposed approach is that these patterns can be utilised to represent SDOH as part of AU CDI and co-ordinate with existing groups with the ongoing development of SEWB terminology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advance care directive - proposed approach is to start with a simple model which looks at status, custodian details/directive location and last updated date • Plan of care - proposed approach is to explore items already in the backlog and investigate further items required for a care plan • Functional status assessment - proposed approach is to explore ADL assessment roadmap and consider other assessments • Pregnancy domain - proposed approach is to begin with the items identified during AUeReqDI <p><i>September CDG Meeting</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There will be a half day workshop on the data model and terminology values for eRequesting and the remainder of the time will be focused on patient summary, reason for encounter and chronic disease management
Sparked Evaluation Update	<p><i>CSIRO Evaluation</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Want to hear from the community on where we can improve and to receive any feedback • Findings from interviews conducted earlier in the year will be published late 2024. A survey will be released after the September event to allow community feedback. <p><i>DOHAC Evaluation</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A survey will be conducted to determine how things are progressing, and they will provide a report with updates on the Sparked outputs
